Happy New Year! July is the first month of the 2017-2018 Toastmasters program year, not January. Every July

1, we have new beginnings possible as club members. This creates the opportunity to make new year's speaking and leadership resolutions. Toastmasters is filled with people who plan early and take action to meet their goals throughout the year. One of those people is Lance Miller.

Lance Miller is a world champion public speaker and Toastmasters instructor who has given thousands of speeches in dozens of countries. Lance Miller said in his August

2014 Kuala Lampur, Malaysia speech at the Toastmasters International Convention (see link below) that you become a better speaker by speaking more often. One way to help members accomplish this is for the Vice President Education to work with each member to establish a deadline and write it on the inside of the manual.

Speaking often can prevent us from losing skills. Don't let that new educational award that you just received stop you from continuing to grow. Challenge yourself to set new goals!

Lifelong learning makes life interesting. Always stretch your strengths to meet new goals.

There is a wealth of materials available through Toastmasters. The Competent Communication and Competent Leadership manuals are only the beginning. There are fifteen advanced speaking manuals covering a range of speech areas from Humorously Speaking to Speeches by Management. There are modules to instruct Youth Leadership (under age 18). There are Speechcraft manuals to give people a brief taste of Toastmasters. These are a few of the resources available to you.

When you earn the Competent Communicator award, you are entitled to two free advanced speaking manuals of your choice. Be sure to take advantage of this freebie.

Lance Miller has many tips. One is to go out there and fail. In Toastmasters, you can be free to be yourself in a safe environment among friends who want to help you to do well. In this safe environment, feel comfortable with failing often.

The times we fail are the times that we learn the most. We do not learn as much from our successes, but we are assured to learn something from our failures. Use failure as the propelling force to new beginnings for you and your fellow club members. The growth opportunities are unlimited.

Use the new Toastmasters year to strive for new challenges and opportunities. Do something different than you have always done. Consider Toastmasters to be an integral part of lifelong learning. Explore all that Toastmasters has available, which may be more than you know. Take a calculated risk among friends. Start early and repeat often. This is a time of new beginnings. Once again, Happy New Year!



News on Pathways and TLI

Toastmasters Pathways

In the Chief Ambassador update from Toastmasters International, the following Pathways information was

received.

- The Pathways pilot is complete and regional Rollout 1 is beginning in Region 14. Club visits are underway. Ambassadors and Pathways Guides have already begun their club visits in Region 14 to provide a Pathways overview.
- There are several Pathways misconceptions currently circulating among members. One common misconception is that current members won't be able to continue working in the traditional education program once they start Pathways. This is incorrect. Current members will be able to use both programs for two years once Pathways rolls out in the last region. However, new members who join clubs where Pathways has already rolled out will only be able to work in Pathways.
- Pathways glossaries now are available in French and Simplified Chinese. On May 30, 2017, District 51, which was part of the Pathways pilot, launched Pathways in Simplified Chinese and became the first district to feature a language other than English. Still being developed are glossaries in Spanish, German, Arabic, Portuguese, Japanese and Traditional Chinese.

The bigger the word, the more often survey responders used it in answering this question.

I got suggestions that we can improve in several key categories. These areas include: more events outside the club, more visibility into communication above the club level, and promoting a better understanding of educational awards and goalsetting. As the new Toastmasters year starts, my Division D leadership team and I will be looking for ways to improve in these and other areas noted on the survey.
