District 24 Annual Conference Registration is Open!

The District 24 Annual Conference is April 20 – 22 in Kearney, Nebraska at the Younes Conference Center. This will be a conference full of excitement! There are two incredible speakers on the agenda for this conference. 2005 World Champion of Public Speaking, Lance Miller, will be the Featured Speaker. Lance will bring his exciting speaking style to District 24. Toastmasters International Region 4 Director, Monique Levesque-Pharaoh, will be the Keynote Speaker at the conference! What an incredible opportunity to learn from two outstanding speakers!

The conference begins Friday, April 20 with a workshop from conference featured speaker Lance Miller followed by the District 24 Table Topics Speech Contest. Lance and Monique will both be speaking on Saturday, April 21. The District International Speech Contest will be in the afternoon. The educational sessions will cover Pathways, Social Media, new ways to use Moments of Truth, and applying Toastmasters to Popular Culture. The day will end with a banquet and awards ceremony.

After the banquet, there will be a show of Hidden Toastmaster Talent. If you have a talent such as storytelling, singing, hula-hoping, or dancing, send your name and hidden talent to John Paul Arias (<u>ipablo_arias@yahoo.com</u>) to become part of a new tradition. After the Hidden Toastmaster Talent, there will also be karaoke!

To close out the weekend there will be a special breakfast on Sunday, April 22 with Region 4 International Advisor Monique Levesque-Pharoah and Region 4 Advisor Pat Hannan.

Cost for the conference is \$49 until April 15. Non-Toastmasters can attend for \$60 a person. There are five meals at the conference, Friday evening, Saturday morning, Satuday midday, Saturday evening, and Sunday morning. Meals are priced separately or if you like, you may purchase the full meal deal for \$120.

The host hotel is the Fairfield Inn & Suites at 501 W. Talmadge Rd in Kearney. District 24 has reserved a block of rooms for the conference. The room rate is \$99.95 plus tax per night. New Ideas!

Do New Ideas Excite You?

The short answer is NO! I am a person of habit. I like the familiar, I like the opportunity of doing the same thing again and see if I can do it better. I like having my time of quiet,

balancing between introspective time and extroverted activities I find exhausting. My preference is an inward focus. New ideas disrupt my quiet.

When new ideas come along, I first process them with my old idea mindset. Then I resist. I want to know who I can blame for this new idea. Can we do it the way we have been doing it? As much as I hate to admit it, blaming others and that new idea is contra-productive.

Why? First and foremost, new ideas help us grow. Second, externalizing the new —declaring it as "that" prevents us from owning it.

Say the following aloud, "your idea," "my idea" and "our idea." Which resonated with you? After serious consideration did "our idea" sound the best? Did you secretly cling to "my idea"? (It is OK to admit it—I did too!)

How can I turn away from focusing on "What else can someone (or something) else do?" and "What or who else can I blame?" Why do I need to take ownership of new ideas? Let me share three reasons:

1. The person I can most effectively control is me, the time wasted attempting to change others is time that could be better spent exploring opportunities to improve.

- 2. When I feel that it is "them" or "it", my impact is at best limited. The time wasted in justifying my position because of the external setbacks, is time better spent planning to succeed. Too often, time is wasted with long lists of excuses which compounds the problem. With ownership of the idea, the focus is on how to make it work.
- 3. If I want to grow as a leader, I need to remember that great leaders are first and foremost accountable for everything they do.

Is the fear of failure holding you back from implementing new ideas? How many ideas did Thomas Edison have for the filament before he invented the light bulb? "The more you do, the more you fail. The more you fail, the more you learn. The more you learn, the better you get." John C. Maxwell. I, you and we want to get better!

Does your club embrace new ideas? Do you challenge your club to do new things? Expanding the experience for members that cling to old habits? This month make the effort to embrace new ideas, invite new people, explore new things! Take ownership and grow. Take this the opportunity to climb to a higher plateau!

Fellow Toastmasters, I challenge you with this idea. Dedicate this month to implement new ideas, find new ways for your members to grow, explore new ideas! Climb to new heights!

The Power of Synergy

The definition of synergy according to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary is a "combined action or operation." Another definition is "a mutually advantageous conjunction or compatibility of...resources or efforts."

Have you completed a High Performance Leadership project? In Toastmasters we often abbreviate it as HPL. Too many acronyms! Think of it as a synergy project. The combining of two or more people's efforts to make something happen. This is the action committee of two or more people you create for your High Performance Leadership or "synergy project." In the High Performance Leadership project in the current educational system, you also create a guidance committee that allows you to think through your ideas with some feedback.

When you go through your High Performance Leadership project, you combine all you have learned before. You organize your thoughts, persuade, and inspire other people to action – just like in your speeches.

Use a High Performance Leadership project not just on the road to get the Distinguished

Toastmasters award. Use it as the approach to making your dreams come true in life. You learn you cannot do it all by yourself. You realize that the combined effect is greater than the sum of its parts.

This applies to your workplace or church. This will apply to your club or business. This will apply to special events that you create or organize. This can apply to anything.

What if you need the seed of an idea to make happen, because you cannot think of something to organize or create at this time? The 2018 District 24 Annual Conference are the seeds to grow a great plan. The more people who lend their creativity and imagination to an event or

project, the grander the results can be.

What about your club? Create a membership drive like no other, using a group of people all working together to that goal. Wouldn't this be an interesting High Performance Leadership project?

What's Your Inspiration?

American essayist, poet and philosopher Henry David Thoreau stated, "New ideas come into this world somewhat like falling meteors, with a flash and an explosion." Translation:

Never underestimate the power of an idea and the difference it can make!

Think about a new idea you had recently. Did it seem crazy at first? As you thought about it some more, did it gradually seem more realistic? This is perfectly normal, according to the experts. Sir Arthur C. Clarke, famed science fiction author, inventor and futurist, observed that new ideas pass through three periods: 1) It can't be done; 2) It probably can be done, but it's worth doing; 3) I knew it was a good idea all along.

Unfortunately, many of us don't get past the first stage. We get bogged down thinking about the negative aspects, overlooking the potential for success. Instead of asking "How can I make this happen?" we ask "What if I fail?" We let that mindset take over before exploring the options.

As you think about how this relates to your Toastmasters experience, when was the last time you suggested a new idea to your club? Whether a new strategy for enticing guests and new members to your club or some other aspect of your club's meetings or functionality, what was the outcome? If you haven't suggested new ideas to your club, why not? Conversely, are you supportive of your fellow club members' ideas?

As we all know, even the most successful clubs could benefit from new ideas that add variety and interest to meetings and may bring potential new members who could benefit from Toastmasters. Who knows what might come of your idea that at

first glance, seemed unrealistic? It might not be exactly what your club needed. But, it might be the spark that inspires your fellow club members to come up with their own ideas, leading to a synergy that ultimately leads to success for your club.

As you look for new ideas in the last four months of this Toastmasters year, consider the District 24 incentives that may inspire you and your fellow club members along the path to success. For example, if you add 5 new, dual or reinstated members by March 31, you will receive the **Talk Up Toastmasters Award**, which includes a special ribbon, discount and other recognition. If you are currently a club mentor or club coach, why not go for the **District Outstanding Club Mentor** or **District Outstanding Club Mentor** or **District Outstanding Club Coach** awards, both with June 30 deadlines. We must never underestimate the importance of ideas as conduits for change and growth. As Albert Einstein so aptly stated, "The mind that opens up to a new idea never returns to its original size." That's powerful!

News on Pathways

Update on Toastmasters Pathways

In February's Chief Ambassador Update from Toastmasters International, the following Pathways information was received.

Rollout updates

The Pathways rollout continues with regions 3 and 5 successfully launching February 13, 2018. Pathways Guides in regions 1 and 11 have begun their club visits in anticipation of a March 20 launch date. Regions 4 and 13 Pathways Guides are also planning visits and visiting clubs ahead of their April 24 rollout, and regions 8 and 9 have completed their Pathways Guides recruitment process. Our District 24 is in Region 4.

Adoption report

In the regions where Pathways has launched, district leaders are reporting that the transition has been much smoother than anticipated and members are enjoying the new educational content. As of February 15th, in districts where Pathways has rolled out:

- More than 33,680 members have enrolled in Pathways — representing 21% of the members where Pathways is available. The average usage rate in districts that were part of the program pilot is 41%
- More than 36,067 paths have been initiated.
- Out of all of the paths in progress, only 187 have been requested in print.
- Materials are now available in French, Simplified Chinese and Spanish.

New languages coming soon

On March 20, 2018, Pathways will launch three additional languages: Arabic, German and Portuguese. In anticipation of this, World Headquarters staff are busy performing critical testing to ensure Pathways materials are ready to support users working in Arabic, German and Portuguese.

Common Member Question

Can I receive Pathways credit for a High Performance Leadership project I completed in the traditional education program? Answer: No. Your completed High Performance Leadership (HPL) project cannot be used for credit in Pathways, regardless of whether it was applied toward an education award or not. For more information about the Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) Award in the traditional program or Pathways, please visit the DTM award page.

Common Chief Ambassador Question

What happens when a club assigned to an Ambassador/Pathways Guide is suspended?

Answer: Ambassadors/Pathways Guides will not be penalized if any of their clubs fall out of good standing. If this happens, the Ambassadors/Pathways Guides are to mark club visits as complete for any suspended clubs, and email the Ambassadors team to let them know. If a suspended club returns to good standing, Ambassadors/Pathways Guides should then conduct their club visit and provide reinstated clubs with the support they need to successfully begin working in Pathways. Also, remember that the Pathways rollout is a great opportunity to build excitement and boost member participation. Ambassadors/Pathways Guides may use this time as a way to reinvigorate any of their clubs that are struggling.

Tool for Progress – Revision of Club Governing Documents

Procedures of organizations are documented in bylaws and policy. Most organizations want to remain 'strong' and 'relevant'. To do so, they usually update their bylaws every two or three

years to reflect current changes in the organization. Clubs of Toastmaster are unique in that they have a club constitution and club addendum in place of a set of bylaws.

The club constitution cannot be amended except by a majority of the votes cast at an Annual Business Meeting or a special meeting of the voting membership of Toastmasters International. (See Club Constitution for Clubs of Toastmasters International, ARTICLE XII.) However, clubs should regularly modify their club addendum.

For Addendum:

Log onto Toastmasters.org and go to Club Central. Choose the club if you are a member of more than one. There will be an option of Addendum of Standard Club Options in the menu or use the following link:

Addendum of Standard Club Options

An excellent opportunity for a member to earn credit in the Competent Leader manual is to chair a committee that reviews and recommends modification to the Club Addendum. A TM club may vote to establish this committee. The Club President may also appoint a parliamentarian – which may serve at club meetings - as well as assist this committee.

In reviewing the Club Addendum, club options (ARTICLE Addendum of Standard Club Options Section 7) include:

- Membership Composition
- Finances: New Member Fee, Club Dues, Reinstatement Fees, Transfer Fees, Inactive Member Dues
- Regular Meetings (Date, Time, Location)
- Executive Committee Meetings (frequency)
- Terms of Office (frequency)

The vote requirement to adopt modifications in the Addendum is at least a majority of the active individual members of the club present and voting at a duly called and noticed club business meeting at which a quorum is at all times present.

Last, but not least, in relationship with other governing documents, a club cannot adopt policy nor ever take action in conflict with the Article of Incorporation and Bylaws of Toastmasters International. (See ARTICLE XII: Amendments to Club Constitution).


The annual meeting will take place Saturday morning April 21 during the annual conference and everyone is encouraged to attend so you know what is going on in the district. It is important though to know that not every person in the <u>district</u> has a vote. The voting members of the council are all active club Presidents and Vice Presidents of Education, Area Directors, Division Directors, and the District Executive Committee. It is <u>important</u> that we have as many of these people present at the meeting as possible to vote on the <u>important</u> items.

While it is encouraged for everyone to attend, it <u>is recognized</u> that not everyone will be able to travel to Kearney. Now if only one of the club officers can attend the conference, they can represent both votes for the club by proxy assignment. <u>In the event that neither of the two voting officers can attend, they can assign their proxies to another club member.</u> According to Toastmaster bylaws, the proxy representing the <u>club</u> must be an active member of the <u>club</u>. The proxy will then be able to cast the two votes for their <u>club</u>.

Proxy forms will be sent out to all clubs in mid-March and is also in this Double Dozen. The completed proxy form must be returned to the credentials committee in hard copy before the start of the annual meeting. It is essential that every club have a voice at the annual meeting, so please consider attending the conference or at least assigning a proxy to represent your <u>club</u>. We want every <u>club</u> to have a voice, and it is the club's responsibility to follow through and help create the future of the district.



As required by Toastmasters International, every year each district must look at the division and area alignment to make suggestions for better placement of clubs within the district. The following is the proposal from the current Realignment Committee. The vote for realignment will be taken on April 21 at the District 24 business meeting.

Members of the District Committee,

The following pages show the current District 24 alignment and two proposals for the alignment of clubs to Areas and Divisions in the 2018-2019 year.

Alignment A: The minimal change approach and the most dangerous as the possible failure of several clubs will jeopardize our alignment. Your approval of this option approves the placement of the new clubs and the moving of one club to Area E41. It assumes that we retain all of the low member clubs except for the 3 clubs with no members.

Alignment B: The safer approach. Division A is reduced to 3 areas as they have no strong prospects for new clubs. Division C, D, and E may need to be adjusted if the low member clubs in those divisions fail.

These proposed alignments will be voted on at the Annual Meeting of the District Council on April 21, 2108.

Guidelines for realignment

- A. The best interests of the clubs and district are taken into consideration when assigning clubs to areas.
 - I. Areas consist of four to six clubs; however, an area may consist of three clubs on July 1 only when an effort to charter a fourth club is in process.
 - II. Under no circumstances may an area have more than six clubs on July 1.
 - III. Advanced clubs may not be segregated into areas nor may areas be segregated by language
- B. A division must have a minimum of three areas.
