

Do you celebrate your club's charter anniversary? This is a way to recognize the charter members still in the club. If there are no longer charter members in your club, celebrate the newest members and members with the longest tenure. Invite former club members to the celebration and invite them to rejoin the club.

Many clubs have end-of-year celebrations in the form of picnics, barbeques or potlucks. The club officers recognize all the accomplishments of the members at this time. These could be within Toastmasters or in other organizations. This is a time to reflect on the previous year and celebrate. What is Recognition?

Toastmasters member recognition is the open acknowledgment and praise of a member's behavior or achievement. It's used to express appreciation, motivate members, and reinforce personal growth.

If you regularly give out authentic, deserved recognition to members, you'll be that much closer to unlocking their full potential. Authentic recognition serves three greater purposes:

Showcase Goal Achievement

Why does it feel so good to get a simple "thank you" from someone? All humans feel the need to be praised at some level. They want to know that their hard work and achievements aren't going unnoticed. When a person achieves a goal, personal or work-related, they feel a rush of achievement, and that good feeling is only amplified when others recognize and acknowledge the achievement as well. When each member completes a level in Pathways, be sure to acknowledge their achievement.

Motivate Effort

Recognition can be tied to more than just completing a Pathways level. Celebrate strong effort when members go above and beyond. Be sure to nominate them for the end-of-year awards. See the d24tm.org website to nominate that special person who went above and beyond.

Recognizing Value

Toastmasters developed the Pathways education program to recognize members more frequently. This was done to show members the value of the program in helping them to grow as better communicators and leaders.

Smedley Award

Program Dates: August 1 – September 30

Can your club add five new, dual, or reinstated members with a join date between August 1 and September 30? Accomplish this goal and you'll qualify to receive a Smedley Award ribbon, named in honor of Ralph Smedley, which you can display on your club's banner.



Qualifying clubs can also earn a special discount code for 10% off their next club order. (The discount code expires six months from the date of issue and is not valid with any other offer.)

Applications and payments for members with a join date between August 1 and September 30 must be received at World Headquarters or online no later than September 30. The addition of transfer and charter members does not count toward Smedley Award credit.

The winning clubs will be revealed online within a few weeks of the submission deadline. Winning clubs should allow up to 10 business days to receive their award if they are located in the United States, and up to 21 business days if they are outside of the United States.

- Club Mentoring Program for helping *new* clubs learn about Toastmasters and achieve self-sufficiency. The typical duration of a mentoring relationship is 6-12 months.
- Club Coach program for helping *existing*, struggling clubs achieve Distinguished Club status. A coach has up to two Toastmaster years to help the club get to a healthier state.

Coaches and Mentors (coaches) have frequent opportunities to provide recognition to their clubs. After all, we give recognition to encourage the behaviors that we want to see repeated. When coaches observe their clubs learning or relearning new skills and receiving the benefits, recognition is due—and due as soon as possible. Delivering recognition is the "secret sauce" for making the connection between actions and results. Deliver some up today!

As provided in the Bylaws of Toastmasters International, Article X, Section 1, a Toastmasters club in good standing is entitled to two votes at the Annual Business Meeting. To make your club's vote count, cast your votes in one of three ways:

- 1. Assign your proxy and send a delegate from the club who is attending the Annual Business Meeting to carry your club votes.
- 2. Designate by proxy the 2021 2022 District Director to act as your club proxy. If (and only if) the District Director is not in attendance, the next senior district officer attending the Annual Business Meeting will act as your club proxy.
- 3. Designate by assigned proxy an active member from another club to act as your club proxy.

NOTE: The club president or secretary must assign the club votes. If the votes are not assigned, they cannot be cast. Votes must be assigned even if you are assigning the votes to yourself.

To assign the club votes, go to www.toastmasters.org/clubcentral, log in, choose the club(s) you are assigning proxies for and click on Club Proxy. Club Proxies are now available for assignment and must be assigned by **August 16**. Please make sure your vote counts!

Fall District Council Meeting

Club Presidents and Vice Presidents Education mark your calendars for the September 16 at 7 pm. This is the date and time for the Fall District Council meeting where you will be asked to approve the District 24 budget and appointed officers. Once again this is **an online meeting**. You will receive an email telling you when the budget is available for your review. The appointed offices to approve are Area Directors, Finance Manager, Public Relations Manager, and Administration Manager.

You will also receive an email asking you to register to attend this meeting. This is to insure we have a quorum in attendance. Presidents and VPEs please plan to attend because no proxies are allowed at online meetings.



Parliamentary Procedure: The Basics

Do you ever wonder why some meetings run smoothly and others do not? Why some meetings drag on and on and never achieve results? One of the reasons this happens lies in the rules we apply to

govern the meeting. Effective meetings are important to everyone.



Toastmasters has elected to use Robert's Rules of Order where recognized. For the District Article XIII: "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the final authority on parliamentary procedure insofar as Robert's Rules do not conflict with any provision of these administrative bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws of Toastmasters International, policies and procedures set by the Board of Directors of Toastmasters International from time to time, or applicable law."

For the Club Article IX Section 1: "Insofar as they do not conflict with the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws of Toastmasters International, Policy and Protocol adopted by Toastmasters International, the Club Constitution, the club's addendum, or laws applicable to nonprofit

corporations, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the final authority as to parliamentary procedure."

The reason for incorporating these rules rests on four fundamental principles:

- 1. Justice and courtesy for all
- 2. Do only one thing at a time
- 3. The majority rules
- 4. The minority has the right to be heard-

This gives rise to the four fundamentals of parliamentary law:

- 1. Facilitate action, remove obstructions
- 2. Enable the assembly to express its will and produce results
- 3. Give every member a fair hearing
- 4. Maintain order

These are the basic premises. As your district parliamentarian (meaning a member of the district who is learning how to use parliamentary procedure in district meetings) I will share as time allows more about this mysterious process called parliamentary procedure and how to use it to make your meetings more effective.
