What is our mission as members and leaders in the Toastmasters organization? How does the Toastmasters Promise support the Club Mission Statement? First, the Club Mission Statement:



We provide a supportive and positive learning experience in which members are empowered to develop communication and leadership skills, resulting in greater self-confidence

and personal growth.

Do you start your meetings with the Club Mission Statement? Does it set the stage for how your meeting is conducted? Toastmasters can be the most positive environment you have ever experienced. New members may have never been in such a group before. It is important to help new and existing members to understand how to support the Club Mission. Support for the Club Mission is well defined through the Toastmasters Promise. The first five promises are:

• To attend club meetings regularly

• To prepare all of my projects to the best of my ability, basing them on the Toastmasters education program

- To prepare for and fulfill meeting assignments
- To provide fellow members with helpful, constructive evaluations

• To help the club maintain the positive, friendly environment necessary for all members to learn and grow

Ralph Smedley said, "We learn best in moments of enjoyment." If members of a club regularly attend the meetings; are prepared for their roles; provide constructive feedback; and make sure the club environment is positive and friendly, then we are supporting the Club Mission Statement by providing a supportive and positive learning experience.

How does the Club Mission Statement and the Toastmasters Promise set the stage for developing leadership skills?

It is very clear the environment we create in a Toastmasters club allows for members to develop their communication and leadership skills. While it might be said all the promises are a demonstration of leadership, the last five promises support the development of leadership skills:

- To serve my club as an officer when called upon to do so
- To treat my fellow club members and our quests with respect and courtesy

 To bring guests to club meetings so they can see the benefits Toastmaster's membership offers

- To adhere to the guidelines and rules for all Toastmasters education and recognition programs
- To act within Toastmasters' core values of integrity, respect, service, and excellence during the conduct of all Toastmasters activities

By serving as a club officer when asked, and confidently seeking out information on how to fulfill the role, your leadership skills will undoubtedly grow. The rest of the promises are there to guide you when learning your club officer role and put it into action. Why Club Coaching?

Did you know that club coaches learn skills useful in business management or consulting?

That's right! When a business wants new ideas on how to streamline processes and generate more revenue, they hire a business consultant. When Toastmasters clubs want new ideas on how to bring in more members and liven up club meetings, they request a club coach. The skills learned from club coaching are transferable skills, that would be beneficial for anyone in business management or consulting.

There are several reasons why you should consider being a club mentor or coach:

- 1. It helps the District be successful
- 2. It helps the Division and the Area
- 3. It helps the struggling club be successful
- 4. Most of all, it helps YOU earn credit towards a Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) award.

To earn the DTM, you are required to:

- 1. Complete two learning paths.
- 2. Serve as a club officer for two six–month terms or one annual term, participate in the preparation of a Club Success Plan, and participate in a District-sponsored Club Officer Training.
- 3. Serve a complete one-year term as a District leader.
- 4. Serve successfully as a club mentor or coach.
- 5. Serve successfully as a club sponsor, or conduct a Speechcraft or Youth Leadership program.
- 6. Complete the DTM project.

A successful club coach will:

- Build rapport with club officers and members
- Instill enthusiasm, camaraderie, and structure within the club
- Assess the club environment, and recommend best practices for success
- Work with club officers to develop a Club Success Plan
- Motivate the club to strive for Distinguished Club Program (DCP) recognition

To be a club coach, Toastmaster members must:

- Be a paid member in good standing
- Not have been a member of the eligible club in the past six months
- Be member of Toastmasters International for at least one year
- Be previous club officer, having served for one annual term or two semiannual terms
- Have completed a minimum of Level 2 in a Path, or an Advanced Communicator Bronze (ACB), or an Advanced Leader Bronze (ALB)
- Have completed the Club Coach Program Training module
