Our District's Annual Business Meeting (ABM) was held on April 25th. During the meeting, we elected our top leaders for the next Toastmasters year starting July 1st.

All of these elected leaders served on the current year's District Executive Committee (DEC). Congratulations to all!

At the ABM, the 2024/2025 District Alignment was approved. If you weren't part of the voting District Council and have not yet reviewed the information, you may access the details on the <u>D24 website</u>, <u>Public Downloads</u>, #2024 Spring District Council folder.

The most significant change was the reduction to three divisions from four divisions. Maintaining four divisions was not possible, and still remain compliant with Toastmasters International Protocol, due to the number of active, eligible clubs in the District. Clubs in Division A were incorporated into the other three divisions. The Alignment proposal provides details about all the factors that comprise the alignment structure.

Just as this year's DEC begins transition planning, current club officers are likely doing the same. I trust that each club has been preparing their candidate slate for club elections in May. Try to hold your elections as early in May as possible so that club officers can plan to attend the Summer Club Officer Training. If your elections are already complete, congratulations! Please be sure to update Club Central.



Speaking of Speechcraft...I am working with Nancy Ellenson, an experienced Speechcraft Coordinator from District 64, to host a Speechcraft workshop during our TLI Club Officer Training. We are still finalizing all the details. Stay tuned for more information soon.

During our District 24 Conference last month, one of our speakers was Sheryl Roush, a nationally recognized expert on marketing Speechcrafts. At the Conference, she shared with us materials about "How to Plan and Implement a Successful Speechcraft." Her presentation was helpful and generated a lot of interest and questions.

We will plan to make those materials available to the entire District membership on the D24 website soon. In her materials, Sheryl shared that the audience for a Speechcraft class is non-Toastmasters. The educational sessions cover a number of topics that play a vital part in effective public speaking and communication skills. The topics can include:
